## **School Choice Legislation Update**

As the legislative session concludes in many states, it is evident that school choice initiatives are gaining momentum across the country. Several states have passed landmark school choice legislation this year. In April, Indiana Governor Mitch Daniels signed one of the nation's most comprehensive school choice bills into law. The Indiana model enacts a variety of reforms and allows applicants to be from low and middle income families. Both houses in Oklahoma recently approved the Equal Opportunity Education Scholarship Act based on Pennsylvania's tax credit model. Oklahoma's tax credit program will potentially award approximately 3.5 million dollars in scholarships to eligible students. In Florida, a series of bills providing for an increase of charter and virtual schools, voucher programs for the disabled, and transfer options for children in failing schools were enacted by the legislature. Florida's effort with these educational innovations was marked by a visit from the President and Secretary of Education in March. Parents of children in the District of Columbia, which is overseen by the federal government, welcomed the reauthorization and reopening of the successful D.C. Opportunity Scholarship program. Also in April, the Supreme Court reaffirmed the constitutionality of Arizona's school tuition organization structure which will allow that program to continue to provide the state's parents with additional options. Several other state legislatures are currently considering school choice bills.

## **National Day of Prayer**

Across the nation, the 60<sup>th</sup> annual National Day of Prayer was commemorated on May 5, 2011. In 1775, the Continental Congress made a proclamation that the country should observe a day of prayer and fasting during the Revolutionary War. President Lincoln revived the practice during the harrowing days of the Civil War. Congress established an annual day of prayer in 1952. In 1988, the first Thursday in May was set aside as the official day for the event during the presidency of Ronald Reagan. In recent years, atheist groups have challenged the constitutionality of the day's existence and observance. The Freedom from Religion Foundation (FFRF) mounted a temporarily successful challenge to the day's existence; but in 2010, the 7<sup>th</sup> Circuit Court of Appeals reaffirmed the constitutionality of the day on the basis of its voluntary involvement. The court also found that the FFRF had no legal standing to bring suit. This year, the National Day of Prayer organizers selected "A Mighty Fortress is our God" as the theme of the event. Well-known Christian, disability advocate Joni Eareckson Tada was selected to be this year's honorary chairman. The national observance was held from 9 a.m. until 12 noon on Capitol Hill. The President's official proclamation cited the "strength, inspiration and solidarity" that Americans have found in prayer throughout our nation's history. #### House Passes "No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion" Act

On Wednesday, the House of Representatives passed <u>H.R. 3</u>, the "<u>No Taxpayer Funding for Abortion Act</u>," by a vote of 251 - 175. The measure had 227 co-sponsors composed of 216 Republicans and 11 Democrats. This critical and comprehensive pro-life legislation, originally co-sponsored by Representatives <u>Chris Smith</u> (R) and Dan Lipinski (D), will bring the provisions of the Hyde Amendment up to date with current statutes. As a result

of H.R. 3, there will be a permanent government-wide prohibition on taxpayer-funded abortion, stronger conscience protections for healthcare service providers, and fewer loopholes in the tax code that have allowed abortion procedures to be covered by federal employee insurance plans. Pro-life advocates recognized that the Hyde Amendment covers only funds appropriated through the annual reauthorization of Labor, Health and Human Services bill; and while this does prohibit the majority of abortions being funded by taxpayers, legislation passed since the adoption of Hyde required additional bans in order to ensure that taxpayer money was not funding abortions through other means. H.R. 3 groups all the various funding bans that cover all federal programs and the District of Columbia into one all-inclusive mechanism. This will eliminate multiple battles to annually reapprove old bans or defund new laws, such as the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Obamacare) that provide for taxpayer-funded abortion procedures. Polls routinely demonstrate that the majority of Americans oppose taxpayer funding of elective abortion procedures. In April, CNN polling revealed that 61% of respondents were opposed to taxpayer funding of abortion. The Supreme Court affirmed that the Hyde Amendment was constitutional in the 1980 case *Harris v. McRae*. The Court's opinion stated that *Roe v. Wade* which legalized abortion did not constitute an entitlement to government funded procedures. If passed by the Senate and signed by the President, H.R. 3 will undoubtedly save the lives of many unborn children.

### **Pennsylvania School Choice Celebration**

On May 3, the Road to Educational Achievement through Choice Foundation (REACH) hosted a commemorative celebration of Pennsylvania's Educational Improvement Tax Credit program at the state capitol building. Hundreds of students from around the state celebrated the decade old program that gives participating companies tax credits for donations to private school scholarships and innovative educational approaches. The tax credit program's popularity results in all the available credits being claimed within days of the availability every year. Last year, over 40,000 children were able to attend the private school of their choice as a result of this program. Over 300,000 children have benefited from this plan over the last ten years. Many other children are also able to participate in and benefit from the creative approaches funded by the initiative. At the state capitol rally, Pennsylvania State Education Secretary Ronald Tomalis announced that the governor would support passage of S.B. 1 to provide parents with even more school choice options.
