- Participation must be at an AACSB school. Home participation is not permitted for these sessions. A school official will be responsible for certifying attendance and active participation.
- Adobe Connect will not require any registration or licensing at the participant end. It is very intuitive and easily used.
 - Each location participating in the **live** training will be **required** to participate in a test session prior to the class. The test will ensure that equipment and connections function properly and that the person who will be responsible for the equipment at the user location understands how to connect and operate the equipment.
 - **Test sessions will be offered July 31 at 9:00 AM EDT, August 5 at 3:00 PM EDT, and the first day of each class at 11 AM EDT. Each test session is 30 minutes.**

Teaching a Child to Pay Attention

Instructor: Dr. Daniel R. Berger II is the founder and director of Alethia International Ministries (AIM), where he continues to write and to speak around the country in churches, and at counseling and teacher's conferences. He is also an experienced pastor, counselor, school administrator, and the author of ten books on Biblical counseling, practical theology, education, and the history and philosophy of the current mental health construct. Daniel earned his B.S. in counseling, an M.S. in counseling/ psychology, an M.A. in pastoral studies, and a doctorate in pastoral theology.

Course Description: Many people falsely believe that children naturally pay attention correctly and that they normally give their attention to the right objects/values. Yet, the Bible reveals in the book of Proverbs that a child's paying attention rightly is a difficult task and one of the parents' most important responsibilities. Furthermore, Proverbs offers a clear pattern of how parents and teachers can teach children to pay attention and to what they should give their attention. This session will provide an overview of how to teach a child to pay attention according to God's created order.

Instructors: Dr. Jenny Copeland holds an MEd in Elementary Education, an EdS in Educational Leadership, and an EdD in Curriculum and Instruction. She is a member of the National Association of Elementary School Principals, the International Society for Technology in Education, and the South Carolina Association of Educational Technology. She has served as a music teacher; an elementary teacher; Assistant to Dean of BJU School of Fine Arts & Communication; a fine arts coordinator; and a class, conference, and workshop speaker; and an assistant principal. Currently, Dr. Copeland is the Bob Jones Academy Elementary Principal.

Miss Katie Klipp holds a BS and MEd in Elementary Education from Bob Jones University. She has over 13 years of experience teaching first grade and currently serves as lead teacher for first grade at Bob Jones Academy. She conducts workshops as well as hands-on technology help sessions for educators and has assisted BJU Press in curriculum revision and professional development projects.

Course Description: If you are satisfied with paper and pencil assessments and raised-hand responses from your students, there is no need to read any further; but if you are searching for engaging assessment methods that go beyond the page, you will want to join this session to learn great ways to assess students using interactive response tools and exciting online assessments! During the first hour, we will include hands-on training in simple online assessment tools, so you will know how to make the assessments and use them in the classroom. Leave some of those pencils and papers behind! Join the future of assessments and watch your students come alive!

QR codes are easy to make and can be used by every grade level and in every arena of education. During the second hour, come and explore with us as we share how to make them, creatively display them, and put them to work the day you return to your classroom.

Understanding and Leading the Z Generation

Instructor: Mr. Ben Schettler is a speaker, writer, consultant, television host and producer. Ben has delivered over 700 keynote addresses on 4 continents and in 37 states. He speaks mostly on the topics of apologetics, Biblical worldview, and cultural engagement. He is the co-founder of the Pure. Truth. Conference, which has reached thousands of students, faculty, and parents with Biblical truth on the topics of gender identity, marriage, and sexuality. Ben's research on these topics has led him to write a book titled, *Being Z*, available in 2020. He is currently writing and producing the second season of the online apologetic video series, The Curious Conversation, and preparing for a new apologetics television show, that he will host and produce, called Truth in Love, which will premier in May 2019. As a consultant, Ben served as the Faith Outreach Advisor for the Dr. Ben Carson presidential campaign. Whether on the platform or in person, you will find Ben's passion is contagious, his humor is relatable, and his message is Jesus.

Course Description: Whether in administration, preschool, elementary, or secondary, every educator needs to know the greatest struggles of the generation he/she is leading. Ben Schettler has spent years studying and researching the Millennial and Z Generation through in-person interviews with leading sociologists and psychologists at universities across the United States. Weaving together headlines, recent research, and practical Bible truth, this session paints a clear and accurate picture of the seven greatest challenges the Z Generation will face. Ben provides sobering stories with hopeful Bible precepts that will inspire you to develop a Biblical worldview in the students you are leading!
